Or, you can download eBooks into free software, Adobe® Digital Editions, or send to your Kindle[®] device or app. Downloaded eBooks can be transferred to eReader devices such as NOOK[®], Sony[®] Reader[™] and many more.

Audiobooks and video can be downloaded into OverDrive® Media Console™ (just MP3 audiobooks for Mac[®] users). Once downloaded, titles can be enjoyed immediately or transferred to a variety of devices, including iPod[®] and many others. Some audio titles can also be burned to CD to listen on-the-go.

Users with smartphones or tablets can install the OverDrive Media Console app to directly download EPUB eBooks and MP3 audiobooks titles to their device. No matter how you plan to enjoy, titles will automatically expire at the end of the lending period. There are no late fees!
