Optimal Resume allows users to create the full spectrum of career documents, from resumes and cover letters to online portfolios, video resumes and professional websites. They can also answer common interview questions and share the recorded answers to get feedback and suggestions for improvement.

"This goes far beyond simple resume templates," said Rhonda Riley, head of technology at the library. "There are sample resumes for dozens of career fields and positions, lists of power words to spark ideas, the ability to easily create and edit your own documents and website, and even options for staging mock interviews with your webcam. Our staff was blown away by the possibilities."
