Most of us have to take a standardized test at some point. Test preparation materials can be expensive, but the Christian County Library offers an online database called *Learning Express Library* with courses and practice tests to help you prepare for

many standardized tests, including the ACT, SAT, GED, GRE, ASVAB, and many more. Learning Express Library is free to use with your Christian County Library card. The database also contains self-paced tutorials on many software programs, basic computer use, and workplace skills to help you prepare for your future. Plus, there are tools for students elementary school age through college to help practice the basic skills they need to be successful in school. Visit http://christiancounty.lib.mo.us/databases.html. You can search for classes and tests using the search box. To begin learning, you'll need to create a user account with your library card number as the username and a password of your choosing. You can add your favorite tests and courses to your account so you'll have quick access to them every time.

Pets as Listeners



Do Libraries Still Matter in the Internet Age?

A recent television commercial for an insurance company features a man and woman talking. The woman says, "They can't put anything on the internet that isn't true." Then, the woman's date, who is supposedly a French model she met on the



internet, appears. He's an unattractive, dumpy man who can't even feign a French greeting. She wanders off with him, convinced that what she learned about him on the internet is true despite appearances.

The commercial amuses us because we know that information we read on the internet is not always reliable. A Google search is certainly sufficient to satisfy curiosity over, for example, the population of Brazil or the life span of a zebra. But what if you've just been diagnosed with a medical condition and you need information about treatment options? Or you need to find the best mutual funds in which to invest your retirement savings? Or you want unbiased information about the history of gun control in the United States? When the information you need has a real impact on your life, it can be overwhelming to try to sort fact from fiction on the internet. This is one reason libraries remain relevant. Libraries and librarians help you find reliable information on the subjects that matter to you, whether on the open internet, or in library-provided sources.

The Christian County Library owns more than 80,000 books, subscribes to more than twenty online databases on a variety of topics, and provides access to millions of other sources from libraries across the U.S. through MOBIUS and inter-library loan. But it's the quality, not the quantity, of information that makes your library matter. Library resources are carefully selected by trained professionals for their credibility based on reviews and research, and for their appeal to our particular community. Of course, the library has plenty of simply popular or entertaining materials. But when you need reliable information on a matter that impacts your library provides free access to resources you can trust as authoritative and accurate. And, perhaps more importantly, the library staff is trained to help you sort good information from bad and find the best resources to suit your needs.
