# Report of the Executive Director January-February 2024

### Administration

- The County has posted the application for eligible seniors to apply for property tax credits as allowed by SB 190. The library is already starting to see some patrons asking for help with the application and we are seeking some information from county officials so we can accurately assist. We expect an uptick in notary services from this. The Legislature is continuing to discuss and propose amendments for various aspects of the bill so we may see changes in the future. We will have a better sense this fall of what the actual impact to our budget could be.
- There are several bills we are tracking that could have an impact on libraries. Several
  bills to reduce or eliminate personal property tax or change real property tax. HB 2498
  would make library boards partisan, elected, and change the nature of trustee duties. HB
  2648 would also make library boards elected but use existing statutes for trustee duties
  and maintain nonpartisan roles.
- The position of Ozark Branch Manager has been accepted by Nicholas Hyten. He will be coming to us from the Chicago area where he has worked in management roles in several public libraries. He will be joining us in mid-March.
- I have had meetings and walkthroughs of the Nixa building with two different architect firms to discuss what might be involved with preparing to plan for a renovation. They are both submitting proposals for a pre-planning study that would help us determine what is feasible, cost estimates, and a few renderings of a space plan. This would be necessary to begin a formal capital fundraising campaign. Once I have reviewed the proposals, I will update the board and discuss the process and costs.

# **Buildings & Grounds**

 Newly classified Director of IT and Facilities Heath Emerson has been hard at work addressing buildings and grounds issues and making plans for long-term maintenance and attention. We have begun the year with many issues to address and significant costs due to inclement weather.

### Collection & Services

Last year we had the Nkoda sheet music database trial and asked for feedback about
the resource. While there was interest in a sheet music database, the feedback
highlighted a user experience that left a lot to be desired. Staff determined the resource
would be cumbersome to use and not worth the price. We are currently doing a similar
process with a Mango Languages ASL add-on.

# **Community Engagement**

- Director of Development and Strategic Partnerships Tory Pegram has agreed to serve on the MACAA (Missouri Association of Community Arts Agencies) board. MACAA is an agency that provides grants for arts programming and has helped fund our Outdoor Concert Series in the past.
- Adult Services Librarian Charlee Evans was accepted into a pilot program by the Network of the National Library of Medicine to help train people in community health information. Through this program Charlee will ultimately provide a class for area library staff on health outreach and programming in the community. The NNLM reimburses the library for the time she spends on this program with a \$1,000 stipend.
- Director of Communications and Community Engagement Nicholas Holladay participated in the Hot Soup, Cold Nights event for the Christian County Homeless Alliance on behalf of the library. We were able to contribute a boxed set of "A Series of

Unfortunate Events" along with some library swag to the auction and it sold for \$135 which will benefit the alliance.



We withdrew several Playaway audiobooks recently and provided them to the Billings
City Library, along with some instruction and troubleshooting info to the volunteers at that
library.



- Canasta is the activity of choice at the Sparta branch with 9 people in attendance in January and they clamored for a repeat.




 I attended the winter Missouri Public Library Directors conference in Columbia in early December. It's always a good time to connect with fellow library directors, hear from staff


- at the State Library, and receive some training. We had a presentation on AI in libraries, had a show & tell session for library swag, and a panel discussion on fundraising.

   recover from disasters. We also learned about 20 new acronyms!


