Library services for educators

Library card drive

We partner with teachers and librarians each September to host a county-wide Library Card Drive. As an incentive, the school with the highest percentage of library card applications is awarded prize money provided by the Christian County Friends of the Library.

Library tours

Staff offer a 'behind the scenes' tour of your local community branch including how to find grade-specific resources.

Special visits to the classroom

We can make special visits to your class to read books, host library card sign-up drives and discuss what it means to be a librarian.

Resource training for teachers and students

Meeting & Study Rooms

Need a place to study or space for a meeting? Within each community branch location are rooms, *free of charge*, for public use during the library's hours of operation.

- Meeting rooms can be reserved up to 90 days from the current date and no more than five (5) times a month.
- Study rooms can be reserved up to one (1) week from the current date and no more than three (3) times per week.

Library events for Teens

Teen Advisory Board

Grades 9–12. The Teen Advisory Board helps plan library events while earning volunteer hours. Apply for a spot on the board at **christiancountylibrary.org/volunteer**. Applications are reviewed and approved by library staff.

Family Storytime all year long

Each Storytime is packed with songs, activities, movement and stories specially designed to promote early literacy skills. Parents and guardians also learn great ideas to develop a love for reading with their small ones. Family Storytimes are offered weekly for kids up to age six.
