

Christian County readers collectively logged one million minutes of reading during the 2019 Winter Reading Challenge in January. Earlier this year, Christian County Library received a \$1,000 from TV's Mark Cuban for achieving the winter reading challenge goal. On May 16, 2019 Christian County Library Deputy Director Katy Pattison and Youth Services Coordinator Dana Roberts shared \$500 of the award with Least of These, Inc., a local food bank that provides food, hygeine, and clothing assistance to struggling families. The remaining \$500 is reserved for future children's events at the Christian County Library.

This September Christian County Library is joining the American Library Association (ALA) and libraries nationwide for Library Card Sign-Up Month, a time to remind parents, caregivers and students that a library card is the first step towards academic achievement and lifelong learning.

A library card opens a world of infinite possibilities through resources and services that give students the tools to succeed in school and beyond. From STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics) programs and family storytimes to online resources for students and parents, libraries transform lives through education.

Libraries offer free and fun educational resources and activities that bring families and communities together.

and p. 17 for teen events. Libraries also play an important role in the education and development of children. Studies show that children who are read to in the home and who use the library perform better in school and are more likely to continue to use the library as a source of lifetime learning.

As part of Library Card Sign-Up month, Christian County Library's Outreach team will be reaching out to county schools this fall, and kids and teens attending participating schools will have the opportunity to sign up for a public library card through their school. The school with most students registered for library cards will win \$200 for their library. Library cards are free to all county residents, and to students and staff of county schools. Por the last two years, Christian County Library's weekly yoga classes have been among the most popular programs offered for adults at the libraries in Ozark and Nixa. Taught by instructor Debra Tucker of 417Create Art and Yoga, the classes regularly fill the library's meeting spaces with an average of 20 participants each session. The library is pleased to announce the receipt of a \$1,300 grant from the Nixa Community Foundation that will fund the continuation of yoga classes for one year at the Nixa Branch Library, with the library continuing to fund the classes at the Ozark Branch.

If yoga seems like an odd choice for a library class, Elizabeth Jones disagrees. Elizabeth has regularly attended the yoga class at the Ozark Branch Library since it began in March 2017, and believes the class has made a difference in her life. "I do think it's important that the library continues to offer classes like yoga. Some people can't necessarily afford \$50 or \$60 a month to attend fitness classes — it has to go to diapers and wipes, and other things."

That's part of the reason why the Nixa Community
Foundation selected Yoga at the Library as a project worthy

of funding through the Rural Ozarks Health Initiative from the Community Foundation of the Ozarks. The yoga classes funded through NCF impact adults of all ages and income brackets, with the goal of establishing habits of regular physical activity among individuals who for whom economic factors, fitness level, or age have been obstacles in the past. Attendees need not be library cardholders to participate in the class.

Library director Geri Godber explained, "People sometimes think of the library as just a place to check out books, but our mission is really to connect people with any resources that help them learn new ideas and skills and connect with their community — that can be through books or other media, or through classes like yoga, as well as the many other programs we offer."

Instructor Debra Tucker agrees. "Yoga classes at the library make it possible for those who would not go to a gym or exercise regularly because of financial issues, intimidation, time, or scheduling issues to benefit from group discipline by committing to stretching and movement." Debra started



practicing yoga after a brain injury, in the hopes that it would lead to better focus and concentration. Now, she loves it for the flexibility and relaxation it provides. "As an instructor, people in class who have been skeptical about yoga regularly tell me they are amazed at the improvements in their physical and emotional, stress reduction, and overall well-being."

The students who attend the library class are a diverse group, both men and women of all ages, backgrounds, and physical abilities. "The great thing about the class is that everyone is accepted and never feels judged. No matter how much or little they can do, there are lasting benefits," explained Debra.

Elizabeth Jones, who has ridden her scooter in the freezing cold so she wouldn't miss the class, added, "It's a big happy yogi family."

Yoga at the Library happens every Tuesday at 6 p.m. at the Ozark Branch Library, and every Thursday at 6 p.m. at the Nixa Branch Library.



Stay Connected:

CHECK OUT A WIFI HOTSPOT

Use your library card to gain access to one week of FREE wireless internet at home or on the go.

You can now borrow WiFi hotspots for free with your Christian County Library card! A WiFi hotspot is a small device that you can pair with your mobile device, like a laptop, smart phone, or tablet, in order to access the internet. The hotspot uses cellular data from Sprint, so users will have free and unlimited access to the internet anywhere where Sprint offers service. The library currently owns 15 hotspots, available for checkout at any Christian County Library branch. The device can be borrowed for one week. If all of the library's hotspots are in use, cardholders can request them just like a book—visit coolcat.org, search hotspot, place a hold, and select your desired pick-up location.

hristian County Library offers a number of ways that library patrons can borrow materials from other libraries. The library's contains about 60,000 items, but a library card allows patrons to borrow millions of other items. Patrons can request titles from MOBIUS, a network of public and academic libraries online at searchmobius.org. Or, they can submit a traditional interlibrary loan request at coolcat.org, and library staff can check for availability of items from libraries across the United States. These services are popular among library users in the know, and Christian County Library employs a busy staff to process and handle requests and materials from other libraries.

Last fall, MOBIUS/Interlibrary Loan assistant Ann Mathews started handling some unique requests from Nixa High School student Dallin Attwooll. "He first caught our attention due to the number of requests he was making, It's unusual for a student to ask for that much material," she said. Attwooll borrowed dozens of books through Christian County Library's interlibrary loan program during his research, and library staff were wowed by both his ability to identify sources and his persistence in obtaining them. "As his sources started crossing our desk, we became interested in the research itself," said Mathews. Attwooll was researching the Holodomor, a man-made famine that killed millions of Ukrainians in the 1930s, for his National History Day project.

National History Day is a program for 6th–12th grade students "focused on historical research, interpretation, and creative expression," according to the NHD website. Kelly Matney, one of Attwooll's teachers at Nixa High School, typically

has all his students complete a project. "They gain extreme research skills... they learn how and where to find information. They learn that research is a marathon and not a sprint. They learn how to properly collaborate and interact with librarians, museum curators, and others."

Matney also told the library he starts the year by helping his students get library cards. Greg Walker, Attwooll's other history teacher explained, "Students need to learn that the internet is not the end-all to research. It should be just one piece of the large research puzzle."

The best National History Day projects created by Nixa High School students are entered into a regional contest held at Missouri State University, and may move on to a state-level competition. Attwooll's project this year, a website titled "The Holodomor: A Dictator's Triumph Over a Starving Nation," which his teacher called "one of the most well-researched projects that has come across my desk in years," took first place in its category at the regional competition. It also performed well in the state competition.

Ann Mathews wasn't surprised by Attwooll's success. "He was such a delight to work with—polite, articulate, and enthusiastic."




This year the Christian
