Do your kids need to do research for a homework assignment, but you don't have time to get to the library? Many families turn to Google, but you can't always trust the source or quality of information available. Help your child ace their assignments without spending extra time or gas. Our kid- and teen-friendly databases contain only educator-approved book excerpts and magazine and journal articles, accessible from your home computer, covering virtually any subject. There's Searchasaurus for elementary school students, and three outstanding sources for junior high and high school students, Issues and Controversies, Today's Science, and World News Digest. All databases are searchable with your library card at <http://christiancounty.lib.mo.us/databases.html>. Library staff are happy to help you or your children learn to use these resources, in person or over the phone. Just ask!

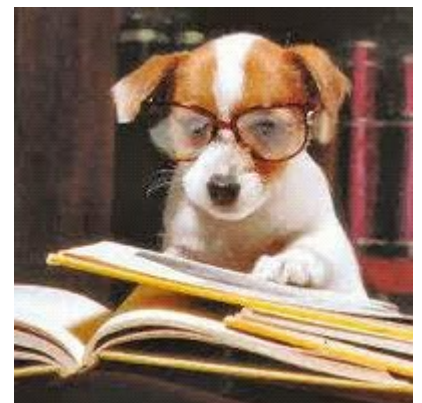

Make the Most of the Online Library Catalog

There are major advantages to using an online library catalog. You can access the library catalog from any computer with internet access. To search the Christian County Library and Clever Public Library catalog, visit <http://coolcat.org/search~S4>. From there, you can find materials by searching for a title, author, or Library of Congress assigned subject heading just like a traditional card catalog. COOLcat also allows for a user-friendly keyword search, so you don't have to know the subject headings or exact title of the item you want. If you click on "Advanced Search," you can limit your search by format, like CD audiobook, DVD, or large print book, or search only for materials published before or after a certain year.

Once you locate an item you want in the catalog, you can place a hold on it with your Christian County Library card. Click "View Locations," where you where the item is and whether or not it is checked out. Click "Place a Hold," enter your name and card number, then choose your preferred pick up location: the Christian County Library, Nixa Community Center, Clever Public Library, or Sparta Town and Country. The library staff will take care of the rest, and call you as soon as your item is ready for pick up.

That's not all the online catalog can do. From the main search page click on New Titles in the column on the right. You can view and place on hold titles in your favorite genre or format as soon as they are entered in the catalog, often before they even hit the shelves at the library.

From that same webpage, you can log in to your library account with your library card number to view your checked out items, renew your materials, check on your holds and fines, and see the library programs for which you are registered. You can turn on your reading history to keep track of all materials you check out. You can even add favorite searches—a favorite author, for example—and have an e-mail sent to you when a new item fitting that search is added to the catalog.
