Take Your Child to the Library Day is February 1st!

Saturday, February 1st marks the third annual Take Your Child to the Library Day, and the first year the Christian County Library is participating. The library will host a library scavenger hunt and library card drive for children who visit. Children of all ages can participate in the scavenger hunt, a fun way to learn more about their library, and receive a candy treat and bookmark for finishing. Children 6-12 signing up for their first library card will receive a sticker and small prize.

Why bring your child to the library? Visiting and checking out books from your public library can play an important role in childhood literacy. A visit to the library is a simple, free way to expose your child to



books and reading in a non-commercial environment. Children can find books tailored to their skill level and interests, and librarians are happy to help choose the right book to encourage reading even among reluctant readers.

The simple act of checking out a library book they have chosen themselves often makes a child want to read. Even children who are too young to read enjoy choosing books, and nothing predicts future reading skills better than whether or not young children are read to regularly. Don't discount the impact of reading for yourself around your children either. Parents who read show children that they value books and learning.

In addition to encouraging reading, a trip to the library is an affordable way to spend quality time with your children. Bring your children February 1st to introduce them to the library. If it's been a while since you've visited a library, know that some traditional library "rules" may have changed. While there are parts of the library, like the study area, where quiet is appreciated, in the children's area, families are encouraged to read out loud, play together, and talk. Doing these simple things with your children can inspire a love of reading. We hope you and your children enjoy it enough that you'll plan to come for special events like free movie day or summer reading events, or even make it a monthly ritual to come pick out books for each of you.
