Technology: whether you need to embrace it or escape it, the library can help



lt's a necessary and useful part of our lives. It keeps us connected to people who are far away, helps us to be efficient in our work and home lives, and lets us access information (sometimes reliable, sometimes not) in seconds. But technology can also be frustrating to use and disruptive to our relationships. Public libraries have embraced this paradox, offering both free technology access and education for everyone, and refuge from tech overload in the form of books, storytimes, and opportunities for connecting and learning through classes, events, and book clubs.

How do you want to change the role technology plays in your life right now? Would you like to brush up on basic computer skills, make better use of your smartphone, or learn more about a specific software program to boost your career?
The library offers free classes, both online and in person. Could you use some digital tools to learn a new language, build a business plan, or do genealogy research?
The library offers cardholders free access to high-quality resources on these topics and many others.

Maybe you or your family need a break from technology. Join one of our book clubs, take a craft, cooking, or yoga class, or check out some seeds from our seed library, premiering March 1, and start a garden with your family. What we hope for each of you is that being a library user helps make your life just a little better this year, whatever that means for you.

Build your small business or non-profit using your library card



hen starting a new business, entrepreneurs need all the help they can get. Christian County Library cardholders have free access to powerful online resources that can assist with starting and operating a business or non-profit organization, and help businesses and organizations gather detailed and accurate data on community demographics.

The first, Small Business Resource Center, is a free online database that covers all aspects of starting and operating a business, including accounting, finance, human resources, marketing, tax, and more. Combining authoritative periodical and reference content, both novice and experienced entrepreneurs have the guidance and resources they need to jumpstart their business development plans.


The second tool is Small Business Builder, a step-by-step online planning tool for starting, managing and optimizing a business or nonprofit. The program's intuitive dashboard walks users through five areas of exploration to develop a business plan focused on long-term success. After inputting their business information, users end up with foundational documents that can be saved and printed, and even includes tools to help create a pitch deck to use in face-to-face meetings with potential investors and customers.

Reference USA is a premier online source of business and residential information for reference and research. It provides up-to-date, accurate, and complete data on millions of businesses and consumers in the United States and Canada. Businesses and individuals can use this tool to do

market research, identify partners, or research competitors. It's also useful for identifying potential customers based on interests, buying habits, and demographics. Lists of potential customers can be exported to help created targeted mailing lists.


Lastly, DemographicsNow is an online resource that provides Christian County Library cardholders with access to robust and highly detailed U.S. demographic data. It is ideal for gaining consumer and market insight when opening a business, finding an untapped audience for products or services, analyzing the needs of a given population, and much more. DemographicsNow also allows users to easily produce a variety of standard or customized reports that will help them make informed and accurate decisions.

Christian County Library cardholders can access all three of these resources 24/7, on any device by visiting christian countylibrary.org/research then clicking on Business. Christian County Library can take advantage of the library's Book-a-Trainer program for a free one-on-one appointment with a library technology trainer to learn how to use these resources.






The Heirloom Seed Library returns to the Ozark Branch

hristian County Library will launch a seed library ✓ for the third year at the Ozark and Clever Branches beginning March 1. Just like previous years, each library cardholder will be able to take home up to four packets of seeds to jumpstart a garden, try their hand at growing a new variety, or help their children learn a bit about gardening. The seeds available this year are donations from several heirloom seed vendors, including Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds, Seed Savers Exchange Heirloom Seeds, and White Harvest Seed Company.

Like last year, the Ozark Branch will hold a seed swap Saturday, February 2 from 1–3 p.m. where community members can bring in seeds they saved from their gardens and take seeds home that others have saved. "All of this goes along with the library's mission to encourage lifelong learning," said Katy Pattison, CCL Deputy Director. "We're grateful to the companies that donate seeds so that our community members can experience what it means to grow their own food, save seeds from year to year, or garden with their children."

"We've heard a lot of positive feedback and stories from library patrons about the seed library over the past few years," said Pattison, "but one of our own staff members showed us the impact it had on her own experience with some photos."

Pam Cox hadn't planted a garden for several years, and used seeds from last year's seed swap and seed library to grow some flowers, herbs, and some giant pumpkins at home. "I love all the bees and the butterflies that the plants attract," she said. "The fresh basil seeds saved me tons of money that I would ordinarily spend to make Thai food with. I used my pumpkins for fall decorations and the sunflower seeds for wildlife food this winter, and then harvested seeds that I'll bring in for the seed swap this year.
