47% of Clever EleMiddle students registered for library cards during Library Card Sign-Up Month

Each September libraries nationwide join together to remind parents, caregivers, and students that signing up for a library card is the first step towards academic achievement and lifelong learning. To celebrate Library Card Sign-Up Month, Christian County Library's Outreach team doubled their efforts reaching out to all county schools to put a card in every student's hand.

Throughout the month, a total of 27 schools participated in the library card drive. Outreach Manager, Scott Villarreal, and Outreach Specialist, Pam Cox, passed out buttons, posters, flyers, bookmarks, and library card applications to teachers and students. Each week they would return to the schools and collect completed library card applications.

Keeping an accurate number of completed library card applications was important. The school with the highest percentage of students registered for a library card would be awarded a check for \$200 sponsored by the Christian County Friends of the Library. That prize money would be used for their school library. After the last library card application was counted, we had a clear winner.

Thanks to the efforts of Lori Vestal, Librarian, and Renee Springer, Library Aide, the Clever EleMiddle School eked out the other schools with 47% of the students registered for library cards. Friends of the Library members, Loretta Hermann and Brian Cox, joined the Outreach team to present the prize check at the Clever EleMiddle School library to Lori Vestal and Renee Springer. Way to go Blue Jays!

Your Story Counts

Christian County, organized in 1859, took part in its first federal census in 1860. That year, the census told a story about the occupations, marriage and school records, as well as gauge literacy levels of Christian County residents. The U.S. Census, recorded every ten years, is where every genealogist begins to piece together the branches on their family tree.

The 2010 U.S. Census discovered that Christian County had one of the fastest-growing populations in the country. Throughout Christian County's development, the census has recorded not only the area's population growth, but how our demographics have shifted as well as the ebb and flow of local professions.

Many decisions are affected by census numbers including the amount of funding cities and states receive for services like schools, health care, roads, emergency planning, and other public needs in local communities. The census is more than a headcount.

Challenges to obtaining an accurate count can be addressed if we prepare and educate ourselves. The benefits to all Missourians are enormous. Seventy-two years from now, when the 2020 census data is released to the public, your descendants will use that information to help tell your story. Don't let your story become lost to history. 


