




Absolution: A Bald Knobber Saga

Unsung History: After the Trail of Tears

Bennett Spring: A Time of New Beginnings

Her series *The Heart of the Spring* is centered around the Darling family and shares the development and growth of the park from its founding in the 1920s through the 1930s when the Civilian Conservation Corps was there, building the many features we still know and love today.

Folklorist and storyteller Steve Otto from the Missouri Humanities Council has worked to collect these tales, many of which can be traced back through well-established traditions rooted in Appalachia and Ireland. Discover the humor of the tall tales and follow the exploits of wondrous characters born in the imaginations of generations of storytellers who migrated from the Old World and went on through the Appalachian Mountains to eventually settle in the Missouri Ozarks.


