





LIBRARY NEWS

On August 8th, Christian County voters approved a renewal of the library's 20 cent property tax rate, which had been whittled down to just 8.87 cents per \$100 in assessed value since the last successful vote in 1971. The library Board of Trustees and administrators are already hard at work carrying out the plan presented to voters, which includes establishing a library branch in Nixa for the first time, making significant improvements to existing branch in Ozark, and eventually establishing new branches in Clever and Sparta.

As of early October, the library is wrapping up negotiations to lease a building in Nixa, located near the intersection of McCroskey and Mount Vernon, after finding 70% of residents surveyed preferred this location to another proposed location. The building is owned by Southern Bank, and located behind their branch in Nixa, which is adjacent to the Nixa McDonald's. Administrators are also working with architects at Sapp Design to create plans for the interior of the Nixa location and a final design for renovations to the Ozark location. If plans go smoothly, the projects may be up for construction bids in December, and both branches could be open as soon as fall of 2018.

The library will start to see increased revenue in 2018, meaning there will soon be funding for new positions that allow the library to better serve the whole county, even before all branches are established. "Folks in the east and west parts of the county should start to see a little more of us next year. We have plans in the new year for working more closely with schools in rural parts of the county, for expanding hours at the existing Clever location, and establishing stronger ties with organizations, individuals, and businesses across the county so we can raise awareness of and access to library services," explained Library Director Geri Godber. "All residents deserve convenient access to the library, and we're working hard to make that happen." About the Artist: Larry DeGraff

Artist Larry DeGraff will be teaching the Acrylics for Beginners series at the library. It's not unusual to find Larry at the end of a dirt road, brush in hand, trying to capture the light unique to that place and time. His goal: to share the beauty all around that we are too busy to see. Larry showed impressive artistic talent at a young age and developed his skills towards a career in illustration. He eventually built a client list that included Warner Brothers and the Walt Disney Company. 

Nixa Resident Turns Lifelong Interest into Skill After Library Program

Rick Hermann has always been interested in the chemistry behind winemaking, and even once thought he'd like to open a vineyard. So when he found out the Christian County Library was offering a winemaking class last July at The Home Brewery, a brewery supply store in Ozark, he was excited for the chance to learn about the tools and science involved.

But Rick didn't just attend the class. He used the knowledge he gained there and his new connection with local experts at the Home Brewery to turn his dream into a skill. "You have somebody else grow the grapes, and you take it and be creative with and have fun with it. It's a hobby." Before the library program, Rick wasn't aware that the resources were available locally for him to pursue winemaking. Now, he's shared dozens of bottles of his own making with friends and family, and gotten friends interested in home brewing. "It's chemistry," he says, "and I love chemistry."

What does Rick wish others knew about Christian County Library? "It's not just about books. It's about the tours, the community contacts that you make, and knowing that the library has other things besides books and bookshelves." What will you learn from the library?


