New Faces at Christian County Library

he number of people employed by the Christian County Library is nearly double what was at this time last year. Beginning last spring, the library embarked on the process of finding just the right people to staff our Nixa Branch, to cover expanded hours at our Clever Branch, and to fill the needs that come with being a multi-branch public library system.

While library patrons don't often interact with some library departments, extra staff in those behind-the-scenes departments can make a big difference in your experience as a library patron. Take Collection Development. The folks in this department select, order, and catalog your library books, and also maintain the library collection on the shelves to make sure that the books, DVDs, and other materials the library offers are community-driven and well-organized. Staff hours devoted to the MOBIUS/InterLibrary Loan department have increased as well. If we don't own the item you want, they're going to do their best to find another library that will lend it to you and make sure it's processed and delivered to you as efficiently as possible. Extra hours in IT mean we can more quickly address computer issues and expand technology

training and assistance to library patrons. Additional staff hours in our Outreach department mean you'll see us finding more and better ways to serve patrons outside of Ozark and Nixa, including a better pick-up and drop-off location for patrons in the Highlandville/Spokane and Billings areas (see p. 6) and a new weekly storytime in Sparta at the Sparta Fire Station (see p. 20.)

Finally, if you're reading the PageTurner for the classes and events, more staff responsible for planning library events means we're offering even more events for every age group and at every branch, plus a wider variety of class topics to suit more interests. If you're receiving the PageTurner by email, watch out for our survey about library programs at the end of 2018 and take a few moments to let us know what library classes and events you've enjoyed, and what you'd like to see more of in the future.

Find Your Next Career at Your Local Library Branch

Each first Tuesday afternoon of the month, Larry Lovig leaves the Missouri Job Center in Branson, where he works as a Business Services Specialist, a little earlier than usual. Lovig drives to the Christian County Library Nixa Branch, where he sets up at a table near the public computers and service desk with some information about the Missouri Job Center. People stop by his table periodically to chat, and usually leave with some informational pamphlets and Lovig's business card in hand. After the Nixa Branch, he'll travel to the Ozark Branch. This is "Meet the Job Center," a partnership between the Christian County Library and the Missouri Job Center designed to raise awareness among job seekers and employers in the county about the resources and services available to them at the Missouri Job Center.

There is no Missouri Job Center location in Christian County, and that's true for many areas of the state. In fact, there are 35 career center locations across the state, while there are 364 library facilities. Library users trategy, Branding is defined as the process of coming up Are you innovative

frequently use library services to search for employment, complete online applications, create resumes, and complete basic and advanced workforce skill development activities such as online classes, career research, and career readiness tests.

Library users often also ask for assistance with these activities from library staff. The library provides a number of tools to assist job seekers such as Book-a-Trainer sessions (one-on-one technology tutoring with a library trainer) the Reference USA database for job searching and business information, Small Business Builder to help create a business plan, and educational and career test preparation resources. But the Missouri Job Center in particular is uniquely positioned to match employers with employees, and help identify and provide job seekers the skills and knowledge they need to obtain employment.

For example, Change One Thousand, a program developed by the Missouri Job Center in Springfield,



is an eight-day class that teaches soft skills, time management, personal finance, creating a professional image, resume building and more. (Register at changeonethousand.org.)

For job seekers, the Missouri Job Center also offers programs and services such as career exploration, networking, resume preparation, preparing for the interview process, basic computer skills, adult education and literacy programs, career-related self-assessments, and "Earn While You Learn," which offers short and long term training opportunities, including apprenticeships and on-the-job training. The Missouri Job Center offers services and information for employers as well, such as job matching, writing job descriptions, posting and promoting jobs, and selecting candidates. The Job Center can also host recruitment events and arrange interview space in its centers.

In spite of the extensive list of services, it can be difficult to for any organization to raise awareness among those who can benefit from the services. Since the library and the Job Center have some shared goals, a partnership was a natural fit. And it's already having an impact. Explained Lovig, "The most memorable experience was helping an individual obtain employment who had been struggling in his job search activities for some time. After speaking with [him at the library], he was provided with assistance from Job Center staff {with]...the interview process, resume development, and career exploration. He was able to take advantage of a hiring event that was being offered at the Job Center, which ended in an offer of employment."

New Pick-Up and Drop-Off Locations Pop-Up Around the County

Christian County is 564 square miles, and home to about 85,000 people. Half of the population of the county lives outside of its two largest cities of Ozark and Nixa. While Christian County Library saves over the next few years to fund the construction of new branches in Sparta and Clever, the Books2Go service continues to deliver requested materials and pick up returned materials at locations across the county without library branches, including Sparta, Highlandville, and Billings.

The library is making a change to its Highlandville pick-up beginning November 1. Previously, library patrons in Highlandville and Spokane could pick up and drop off their library materials at the gas station located at 160 and EE. Pick up happened in an unmanned locker box, which unfortunately experienced frequent technical issues. The new pick up location is Double E Burger and Ice Cream Shoppe, located at 339 Kentling Avenue in Highlandville. Patrons will be able to pick up requested materials inside the restaurant, and return in a drop box outside next to the building. "We're excited for this new partnership with Double E. It should provide more reliable access for library patrons in the Highlandville and Spokane areas, and it doesn't hurt that their food is pretty good too," said library Executive Director Geri Godber.

The library's other recently added pick up location is the Billings City Library. The Billings City Library is a volunteer-run library located in a city-owned building located at 291 NE Highway 60 in Billings. While this library is not part of the Christian County Library system, it has a unique collection of books for all ages, and offers classes and events. The Christian County Library partners with the Billings City Library so that Billings

residents can have access to Christian County Library resources close to home. CCL patrons can pick up requested CCL materials at the library's front desk, and return both CCL materials and Billings City Library materials in the outdoor book drop.

Christian County Library's longtime partnership with Sparta's Town and Country Grocery continues. East Christian County residents can choose Sparta as their pick up location, then pick up at the store's customer service desk once they've been notified their items are ready. Library materials can also be returned at the book drop outside the building. "You'll also be seeing a lot more of library staff around Sparta for other library services as well as our staff has expanded and we plan in earnest for the new branch to be constructed there as soon as the money is saved. We'll be setting aside several hundred thousand dollars each year over the next few years to fund the east county and west county branches," said Godber.

"We're committed to expanding access to library services to citizens in all parts of the county," she added, "and having convenient locations for all patrons to pick up and return their library materials is an important part of that goal."


COMMING IN JANUARY 2019

Hello, Hygge!






The Little Book of Hygge: Danish Secrets to Happy Living by Meik Wiking




